- Leads to using people to fulfill our need to belong, be liked, and be desired more than actually loving people

•	Our joy is dependent on what tomorrow holds rather than who we are in Christ today

•	Suffering is a reality in a sinful, fallen world (physically, emotionally, financially, mentally, relationally, spiritually)				
•	When we suffer, we can easily allow our hurt to become our identity




