Obligation: "I have to"	Opportunity: "I want to"
Impersonal: "Involves something I have or do"	Personal: "Involves all that I am"
Conditional: "If you do your part, I'll do mine"	Unconditional: "I'll do my part whether you do yours or not"
Leverage: "I look out for my own best interest"	Loyalty: "I am looking out for your (or our) best interest"
Suspicion: "I want assurances that you will do your part"	Trust: "I will certainly do my part"
Business: "What will it take?"	Relational: "Whatever it takes!"
Compromise: "I will meet you half way"	Sacrifice: "I will give 100%"
Temporary: "Once all stipulations have been met or not met, the contract is over"	Permanent: "I will continue to do this as long as I draw breath"
