## Marriage Lesson Summaries

### **Lesson One: Marriage Myths & Truths**

- 2. **Gifts:** (characteristics listed in Scripture, such as teaching, hospitality, service, or wisdom) I love how you lead our family, how you handle God's Word, how you pray for our family, how you teach our kids from God's Word, how you try to understand me and let me express myself, your patience, your kindness and gentleness, your strong faith, your insight and discernment, your wisdom, your gifts of administration and organization, your self-discipline and follow-through, your joy for life, your positive attitude

3. **Strengths:** (might be something like a good decision maker, make people laugh) *I love your* sense of humor and how you make people laugh, you're a man of honor who stands for what is right, you're a woman of great resolve, your word is your bond, you see things in a positive light, your cup is always half full, you have a strong sense of loyalty, you are an encourager, you take charge of situations when others might shy away, you care deeply for your family and loved ones, you sacrifice for your family, you make people feel welcome, you put people at ease, you're a good conversationalist; you make every place feel like home, you bring out the best in people around you
